

Environmental labelling of packaging

To comply with the EU Directive 2018/851 on waste and the EU Directive 2018/852 on packaging and packaging waste, OMFB has introduced on all packaging the identifications required in order to recognize the materials used and allow their disposal as required by the laws in force.

For some parts of packaging, for technological reasons, it is not possible to identify the material used. In these cases it is necessary to refer to table 1 which shows, for each material used by OMFB for packaging, the reference to the descriptions indicated by the European directives in order to allow correct disposal.

Below are the rules for the disposal of packaging waste:



- *verify the possibility of reusing packaging*
- *empty the packaging before delivering it to collection*
- *check the code on the packaging to perform the correct disposal*
- *reduce the volume of packaging*
- *check the provisions of your municipality*

For the correct disposal of our packaging, please refer to the following indications:
